Perhaps you've been wondering about ... what Ordinary Time is? Last weekend we celebrated what is known as the second Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is in fact the first Sunday of the second week of Ordinary Time that begins immediately following the Baptism of the Lord which we celebrated last week. Ordinary Time is not a church season. It is a term used to describe the days in between seasons. The term is used to help us organize our liturgical books so we know which scripture readings to read and which prayers to say. We organize our readings according to order, hence the term "Ordinary Time". We will only have a few weeks of ordinary time, as Lent begins soon. During this time, we will hear readings that speak about the implications of discipleship and each of us can ask how we are going to continue to bring the light of Christmas into this time of transition.
