# St. John of the Cross, Feast Day: December 14th

John was born in 1542 at Fontiveros, Spain, He entered the Carmelite community and waw ordained in 1567. With the great Carmelite mystic, Teresa of Avila, he worked for the reformation of his order, helped found the reformed ('Discalced') Carmelites. During his life, he suffered much, enduring imprisonment, humiliation, and ill-treatment. His writings are both classics of spirituality and of Spanish literature. His best known works are The Ascent of Mount Carmel, The Dark Night of the Soul, and The Living Flame of Love. He dies in 1591, was canonized in 1726 and proclaimed Doctor of the Church in 1926.

John of the Cross is the patron saint of mystics, contemplatives, poets and of St. John of the Cross Parish Community!
