## INCOME TAX PREPARATION For Eligible Individuals

Free income tax preparation for low income individuals is offered by the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP), coordinated by the Canada Revenue Agency. Contact the parish office to check eligibility and to book an appointment on Saturdays from 9 AM to 11:30 AM, during the months of March and April.

Due to the current restrictions, all tax preparation will be completed by way of telephone interview with the approval of the taxpayer.

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**

To qualify for the CVITP program, the income requirements are as follows:

• \$35,000 for a single person who has no dependents

\$45,000 for a single parent and 1 child plus
\$2,500 per additional dependent
\$45,000 for a couple plus \$2,500 per dependent

The clinic does not complete tax returns for individuals with rental income, capital gains, selfemployment / business income or returns for deceased individuals.

Interest income must be below \$1,000.

Friday 7pm Stations of the Cross and Holy Mass, Saturday 6pm, and Sunday Masses requires registration. Registration opens on Mondays at 8pm.

## **4th SUNDAY OF LENT REFLECTION** Second Scrutiny Sunday

A man born blind from birth encounters the Lord Jesus. Jesus spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the pool of Siloam"—which means Sent. So he went and washed, and came back able to see.



There is always a deeper spiritual reality taking place in the

Gospels. The physical healing of the man born blind is pointing toward a spiritual healing that the Lord desires to accomplish within us. When we come into contact with Jesus Christ, our blindness is corrected.

Let's apply this Scrutiny to our own lives. We all come into this world blind—in a way. I've never heard of a baby entering into this world with eyes wide open. Our eyes are closed at birth and slowly—very slowly a baby begins to adjust to the new environment. They are not living in fluid any longer! No wonder they scream!

When we come into this world, we are all blind in many ways.

Our eyes need time to adjust to the intensity of the light. As our eyes open, a whole different world is set before us.

Even after we receive the Sacrament of Baptism as children and are made children of God, we need to be instructed in the Faith. We need to be instructed to choose the good and to avoid evil.

Our spiritual vision needs to be awakened. We do not come into this world knowing that we have a supernatural destiny. That has to be told to us. We do not come into this world knowing that God the Father sent His Only Begotten Son into the world to save us from our sins. All of these truths from Divine Revelation have to be taught and explained to us.

Baptism disposes us to receive the Truth of Divine Revelation. The Grace that we receive in Baptism has to be nourished and cultivated or the world, the flesh and the devil will damage our ability to see with the vision of Faith.



Over the course of our lives, even though we may have raised in the Faith and received the Sacraments, we develop a vision problem.

Perhaps we develop spiritual cataracts that keep us from perceiving the Truth of Divine Revelation.

Through encountering the God-Man Jesus Christ in the Sacraments, He corrects our "vision problem."

May I suggest making a thorough examination of conscience this Lent and make it a priority to receive the Sacrament of Penance

(Confession) before Easter. Maybe there is something in your life that you have never brought up in Confession, perhaps because you didn't know how to say it or out of embarrassment. It might be something that is preventing us from seeing with the eyes of Faith in a clear manner. Don't be afraid to confess it, drop it and move on.

In the Sacraments, our "vision problem" is corrected and we are given beginning of the vision of a supernatural reality that ends in Eternal Life with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit in the Glory of Heaven.

There and only there, will our "vision problem," be fully corrected.

Earlier today, the provincial government announced changes to the restrictions on places of worship currently in the Grey (Lockdown) Zone. As of Monday, March 15, 2021, churches in this designation (in the archdiocese, currently Toronto and Peel Regions) will be permitted 15 per cent capacity for religious services.

This is a significant improvement from the hard cap of 10 people that has been in place for several months and it is a more balanced approach in light of the recently relaxed restrictions in other sectors.

## Your Voices Were Heard

A week ago, we launched the "A Place to Worship" campaign, inviting the faithful to contact their Member of Provincial Parliament to ask for a fair and balanced approach to restrictions for places of worship. More than 13,000 letters were written, with 80 per cent sent within 48 hours of the request. I am grateful to all those who participated in the campaign.

Earlier this week, a diverse group of faith leaders had the opportunity to meet virtually with Premier Ford, Minister Elliott and Dr. Williams to discuss our concerns. I wish to extend my profound gratitude to the provincial government for sharing generously of their time and for the healthy dialogue that was exchanged.

I know that many Members of Provincial Parliament also advocated for a just and equitable approach for places of worship, on behalf of their constituents, and I thank them as well.

## WorshipSafe Health & Safety Protocols

As Catholics, the source and summit of our spiritual life is participation in the Eucharist. The faithful have not been able to experience this reality since December 2020 in Toronto and Peel.

In light of today's announcement, I have asked churches in these areas to begin celebrating public Masses as soon as they are able to implement our WorshipSafe health and safety protocols, as early as March 15, 2021 and no later than Thursday, March 18, 2021. Please contact your local parish for more details regarding their plans.

These safety protocols have been in place since our re-opening in June 2020. From June to December of last year, with attendance of 1.5 million, fewer than 50 people who attended our churches reported COVID-19 cases; none of their cases was traced back to the church as a source of community transmission and there is no evidence that they infected others while at church.

## **Continued Vigilance**

I do wish to stress that the Grey (Lockdown) Zones are still very much in areas where positive cases of Covid-19 are highest in the province. We must continue to take the necessary steps, out of love for neighbour, to protect one another. We recognize the vast majority of the faithful will not be attending services in person.

In addition to our WorshipSafe measures, livestreaming of services will continue and dispensation from the Sunday Eucharist remains. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.

## A Time for Christian Love

This is a time of great emotional and spiritual trauma, and people need the strength offered by faith. Whether it has been comforting the family grieving the loss of a parent, praying with a spouse who has experienced domestic violence, or assisting a suicidal parishioner suffering from isolation and insecurity in the midst of the pandemic, faith communities continue to be on the front line of prayer, care and outreach.

We will continue to safely and thoughtfully support those who need us most during this period of pandemic, as we continue to pray for those who are sick, those who have died and those who continue to care for them.

Thank you once again to all those who engaged in respectful dialogue with their elected Member of Provincial Parliament. May God continue to bless you now and always.

#### Last year 2020 St John of The Cross Vincentians accomplished:

251 Home Visits. We Visited142 Adults & 100 Children.We delivered over; 300 cartons of food, 50 boxes of diapers, wipes, depends and toiletriesWe gave out \$50,455.00 in food vouchers and 484 bus tickets.

#### ADDITIONALLY, WE:

Paid Utilities Bought Tables, Chairs, Beds and Mattresses Twinned with Our Lady of Angels Church, Kingston Jamaica Last Christmas, we spent \$5,475.00 in food vouchers and gave \$9,680.00 in gift cards

Christmas 2020 we served 73 families. We also gave them food hampers We have no age limits and do not need any documentation.

Last September, we distributed 54 x 100.00 vouchers (5400.00) to children towards back-to-school costs.

## **OUR MOST IMPORTANT ROLE HOME VISITS**

On our home visits we also brought information on programs that could help people to help themselves. That is our most important role.

Our 36 volunteer members spent 846 hours providing services to our Neighbors In Need despite the Covid 19 pandemic.
