Okay, guys. Now that you have your advent wreath all ready (we had the instruction of how to make an advent

wreath in the last issue of the bulletin), ask Mom and Dad to bless the family advent wreath and light the 1st purple candle. There is a prayer in the next page that the family can say together for the Blessing of the



Family Advent Wreath and the Lighting of the First Advent Candle. This is going to be a wonderful tradition that your family can do every Advent Season. You can sing songs together too. Make it a special event. Maybe do it before dinner so you can feast after the prayers.

Talking about Advent, do you know what that is?

Well, the word Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming! And we need to prepare ourselves. Similar to preparing ourselves when we go to a birthday party—we dress up, we bring a gift, we get excited as we think about seeing some friends at the party - we also prepare ourselves for Jesus coming. You see, boys and girls, when Jesus comes, He only wants to be one place—in our hearts. He loves you and me and everyone else so much that He wants to stay in our hearts. When we prepare for Jesus coming, it means that we need to prepare our hearts. If you already have your first Reconciliation, then Advent is a great time to come again and confess our sins to a priest and reconcile our relationship with Jesus that may have been hurt by our sins. God has many wonderful graces or gifts that He wants to give you and me in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also called Confession.

At St. John of the Cross, you can come for confession after the 9am morning Holy Mass from Monday to Saturday or by appointment. We will also have an Advent Parish Reconciliation evening on Monday, December 13th from 7-9pm where 10 priests will be here to hear confessions.

So, boys and girls, let's P-R-E-P-A-R-E!

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN PRAYER AND HOPE

Prayer is an exercise of desire. Man was created for greatness—for God himself; he was created to be filled by God. But his heart is too small for the greatness to which it is destined. It must be stretched.: By delaying (His gift), God strengthens our desire; through desire he enlarges our soul and by expanding it, he increases its capacity (for receiving Him)". All respond: Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession and in the Lord's Prayer: **Our Father.**

Then the leader invites:

Let us now pray for God's blessing upon us and upon this wreath.

After a short silence, the leader prays:

With hands joined, the leader says: Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:

he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,

he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath.

May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
