# FAMILY ACTIVITY FOR THE WEEK:

## 3rd Sacrament: HOLY EUCHARIST

Hello, boys and girls! You probably noticed that we have been talking about Sacraments lately. You are right, and we will be covering all seven of them. You know why? Because Jesus Himself gave us the 7 Sacraments! You will see it in the bible.

We have covered Baptism and Reconciliation in the last two weeks. Now, we are going to talk about the Holy Eucharist. Do you know when Jesus gave us the Holy Eucharist? If you said at the last supper, you are right! Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the last supper, the night before He died. When they were sitting around the table to eat, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it and said, "Take this all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you."

When they finished eating supper, he took the chalice, gave thanks, he said the blessings, and gave the chalice to his disciples saying, "Take this all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of

my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me."

So you see, boys and girls, Jesus gave us His Body and Blood as divine nourishment for our souls. Jesus always takes care of us!

From the red grapes, we make the wine.
From the grains of wheat, we make the bread. During Consecration in the Holy
Mass, the bread and wine is changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. How do we know this?

Because Jesus said so ... "This is **My** Body ... This is **My** Blood."

So the next time we line up for Communion, boys and girls, let us remember who we are receiving. Let us receive Jesus totally present in the Consecrated Host with much respect and love.

When the priest or Eucharistic Minister says, "The Body of Christ," we bow and say, "Amen."









## **CATHOLIC FAITH Q & A:**

### Q: I don't think that the Church teaches that the Saints are omniscient. How are they made aware of our prayers, which are directed to them?

A: Our communion with the Saints, is accomplished in and through Jesus Christ, who is the head of the Body, the Church. All the members of Christ's body, those here on earth (the Church militant), the Saints in heaven (the Church triumphant), and those in purgatory (the Church suffering), are members of the one Body of Christ, and are united by him, and through him who is the Head.

To use an analogy, my right hand has communion with my left hand not because my hands have their own capacity to work together. Rather, my right and left hand have communion and can work together only in and through the head of my body, which unites and directs them. And so it is with the members of the Body of Christ. In this regards, St. Paul teaches, when one member suffers, all the members suffer, when one member is glorified, all the members are glorified (1Cor12:26). And there is thus a communion of the all the members in the one Body.

That the Saints are aware of us, and pray for us before the throne of God is attested in Scripture in Revelation 5:8. There is also the ancient tradition wherein the martyrs and Saints are invoked for help.

The communion of Saints does not occur apart from Jesus Christ, but rather, it is facilitated by him through whom and in whom all things are and subsist, and who is the head of the Body of the Church uniting his members.


