FAMILY ACTIVITY FOR THE WEEK:

4th Sacrament: CONFIRMATION

Boys and girls, do you know that the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation are closely related? Yup! They sure are. The Sacrament of Confirmation perfects in us that which was begun in Baptism. Hmmm ... what does that mean? It means that when we were baptized, we become children of God. We were given special help, called grace, so that we may grow in faith and goodness.

Confirmation unites us more firmly with Jesus Christ and the Church. When we get confirmed, we receive another special grace to deepen and strengthen our faith so that we can help others.

During confirmation, the bishop or the pastor of the parish, places his hand upon the head of the person to be confirmed. This is called the laying on of hands. Do you know, boys and girls, that this practice of laying on of hands for the baptized Christians started during the time of the apostles? That was more than 2,000 years ago and the Church continues to do exactly that.

After the laying on of hands, the bishop or the pastor traces the sign of the cross on the person's forehead using the Sacred Chrism (this is called anointing) and says, "Be sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit" and the person to be confirmed re-

sponds by saying, "Amen."

Now, what is the sacred chrism? It is a mixture of olive oil and balsam, that the bishop consecrates once a year during the Chrism Mass. It is the



same oil that is used during baptism, during a priest's ordination, during a consecration of a church, and the blessing on an altar or vessels used during Holy Mass.

Just a few more thoughts about Sacraments:

Sacraments are efficacious signs which means that they not only signify but they cause. A stop sign indicates that a motor vehicle is to stop. If a stop sign is to be efficacious like a sacrament, it would not only indicate that the driver should stop, it would jump into the street, and by its own power, physically prevent the motor vehicle from moving. What makes the sacraments efficacious? From whom do they acquire their power? The power of the sacraments flow from Jesus Christ Himself, from His passion and death. Thus, every sacrament is laden with the divine life of Jesus and is a portal of grace through which we become incorporated into His divine life—we immersed in Him, He living in us. Neither time nor space can limit the supernatural reality of this incorporation.

CATHOLIC FAITH Q & A:

Q: Jesus drove out some demons into a herd of swine, which ran down the bluff, into the water and drowned. Could not such an action be construed as cruelty to animals?

A: Well, the pigs are not really the point of the story, and we ought not to get too focused on them. More to the point of the story is the authority of Jesus Christ to cast out demons.

Thus, one might respond to the cruelty charge, that the Lord God has the capacity and authority to do this to the pigs, just as you and I might go to our garden, uproot withered tomatoes and replace them with corn. Further, having authority over animals, we also lead pigs to slaughterhouses.

One might still argue that driving the demons into the pigs was an arbitrary and unnecessary act by Jesus. But perhaps the Lord has reasons. For example, he may have wished to inspire a holy fear in those who saw the action. It was surely a memorable action, and while the townsfolk initially reacted with fear, it would seem they later welcome Jesus back with faith (Mk 5:17-20:7:31). Hence, Jesus makes use of the animals to bring blessings to human beings, which is fitting.

Culturally, pigs were considered by the Jewish people to be unclean animals. Thus the pigs also help to fittingly illustrate the uncleanness of demons, and the fate of those persisting in uncleanness.
