

# INCOME TAX PREPARATION For Eligible Individuals

Free income tax preparation for low income individuals is offered by the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP), coordinated by the Canada Revenue Agency.

Contact the parish office to check eligibility and to book an appointment on Saturdays from 9 AM to 12:00 PM, during the months of March and April.

Due to the current restrictions, all tax preparation will be completed by way of **telephone interview** with the approval of the taxpayer.

**To qualify for the CVITP program**, the income requirements (Approx.) are as follows:

- \$35,000 for a single person who has no dependents
- \$45,000 for a single parent and 1 child plus
   \$2,500 per additional dependent
- \$45,000 for a couple plus \$2,500 per dependent

The clinic does not complete tax returns for individuals with rental income, capital gains, self-employment / business income or returns for deceased individuals.

Interest income must be below \$1,000.

# FAMILY ACTIVITY FOR THE WEEK: FASTING

Okay, guys. We covered Almsgiving in last Sunday's issue of the bulletin. Remember that there are three pillars of spiritual discipline that we can do during Lent. These pillars are prayers, fasting, and almsgiving. They are meant to help us have a good preparation for Easter. For this issue, let's take a look at Fasting.

When you hear the word "fasting" what comes to your mind? Most likely, it means less food, right?

Something like, eating only one full meal a day and two smaller meals or snacks the rest of the day. Well, fasting is not only about food, especially for you, boys and girls, since you're still kids and you need food to grow



but there's different ways of fasting that children your age or the whole family can do.

For example, the family can choose to do digital fasting. You can choose which technology your family can let go during lent.

How about fasting from sweets and salty snacks like chips, chocolates, French fries, cakes, and soft-drinks? Here's an idea .... You can use the money you save from fasting and put it in the Family Sac-

rifice Jar (see last issue of the bulletin) for almsgiving.

And, guys, here's another way of fasting. Nothing to do with food but everything to do with attitude.

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
Fast from anger and practice being patient.
Fast from yelling and use normal voices.
Can you think of another way to fast?
Ask Mom and Dad for some ideas.
Maybe you can do a family fasting activity together.

# **CATHOLIC FAITH Q & A:**

# Q: What are the Catholic observances during Lent?

#### Answer:

- 1) <u>Holy Mass</u>: Making more frequent participation in the Holy Mass during the week is an excellent Lenten observance because the Eucharistic celebration is the most sublime of Christian prayers.
- 2) Lectio Divina: It is the practice of slow, prayerful, meditative reading of the selected passages of the Sacred Scripture. It is a major part of our Lenten prayer life which enables us to listen to God talking to us. According to Pope Benedict XV it is "the diligent reading of Sacred Scripture accompanied by prayer brings about that intimate dialogue in which the person reading hears God who is speaking, and in praying, responds to him with trusting openness of heart" (cf. Dei Verbum, n. 25).
- 3) <u>Fast and abstinence</u>: Fasting is taking only one major meal per day and abstinence is avoiding meat. Lent is traditionally a time of fast and abstinence. Evidently, the obligations surrounding this have been much relaxed in the West in the past few decades, but the relaxing of the obligation does not mean there is not value in still opting to pursue these practices. Indeed, there is nothing (outside of health and age) to prevent one from taking up the practice of devotional fasts and abstinence.
- 4) **Decide on Lenten sacrifices** appropriate to the age of each child in the family, reminding them that our souls need this spiritual exercise to gain strength for living as Christians, just as our bodies need exercise to remain healthy. Our sacrifices are like a gift offered to God, and all real gifts "cost" the giver something.

- 5) **Sacrament of reconciliation:** Lent is a time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation so that we may put things right with God and others.
- 6) Acts of charity: Find out some one in need of our prayer, help, support or encouragement in our neighborhood and do with utmost sincerity what we can.

### 7) Participation in the "Way of the


**cross**" devotion in the parish church to meditate on the suffering and death of Jesus for us sinners and to cultivate a holy fear of sin and its seriousness.
