CATHOLIC FAITH Q & A:

Q: When Holy Communion is distributed, why is "The Body of Christ" said?
Why not say, "The Body and Blood of Christ." Or better yet, "This is Jesus."

A. We use the word "body" for several reason. First of all, Jesus himself used the word "body" (soma in Greek) when giving the Eucharist for the first time: "Take and eat, this is my Body (soma)." Hence we, in conformity to Christ, use this way of speaking of the Eucharist.

Secondly, both the English word "body" and the Greek word "soma" can refer strictly to the physical dimension of a person, or more broadly to the whole person. In English, I can say, "My arm is part of my body." Here I am referring to my physical dimension. However, I might also say, "I am somebody," which refers not only to my physicality but to my whole self. We can also do this in the plural such as when we speak of the "body of believers," or the body-politic." Here we do not refer to a physical body, but rather to the sum total, or the majority of some group.

Hence, we do not exclude any dimension of Christ by referring to his "Body," as if we were only referring to his flesh. Rather, "Body" here refers to the whole Christ. Surely, it pertains to a living human body (and Jesus is quite alive) to have not only flesh, but also blood and soul together. We also receive with his body, his divine nature since it is untied to him hypostatically.

And while we do speak of what is in the Chalice more specifically as the Blood of Christ,

this is only to distinguish its species (i.e. what we perceive) from the host. But once again, Jesus is alive and glorified and his body, blood, sou and divinity are together. Here, even in the smallest drop of Precious Blood, the whole Christ is received.





INCOME TAX PREPARATION For Eligible Individuals

Free income tax preparation for low income individuals is offered by the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP), coordinated by the Canada Revenue Agency.

Contact the parish office to check eligibility and to book an appointment on Saturdays from 9 AM to 12:00 PM, during the months of March and April.

Due to the current restrictions, all tax preparation will be completed by way of **telephone interview** with the approval of the taxpayer.

To qualify for the CVITP program, the income requirements (Approx.) are as follows:

- \$35,000 for a single person who has no dependents
- \$45,000 for a single parent and 1 child plus
 \$2,500 per additional dependent
- \$45,000 for a couple plus \$2,500 per dependent

The clinic does not complete tax returns for individuals with rental income, capital gains, self-employment / business income or returns for deceased individuals.

Interest income must be below \$1,000.

The Velveteen Rabbit

Marjorie William's children's story book, *The Velveteen Rabbit* tells the story of a stuffed toy rabbit given to a young boy as a Christmas present. The velveteen rabbit lives in the nursery with all the other toys, waiting for the day when the boy will choose him as a playmate.

In time, the shy Rabbit befriends the tattered Skin Horse, the wisest resident of the nursery, who reveals the goal of all nursery toys: to be made "real" through the love of a human. One night we get to overhear their conversation..

'What is REAL?' asked the Rabbit one day, as they were lying side by side near the nursery fender, just before Nana came in to tidy up the room. 'Does it mean having things that buzz inside you and a stick-out handle?'

'Real isn't how you are made,' said the Skin Horse. 'It's a thing that happens to you. When a child loves you for a long, long time, not just to play with, but REALLY loves you, then you become Real.'

'Does it hurt?' asked the Rabbit.

'Sometimes,' said the Skin Horse, for he was always truthful. 'When you are Real, you don't mind being hurt.'

'Does it happen all at once, like being wound up,' he asked, 'or bit by bit?'

'It doesn't happen all at once,' said the Skin Horse. 'You become. It takes a long time. That's why it doesn't often happen to people who break easily, or have sharp edges, or who have to be carefully kept. Generally, by the time you are Real, most of your hair has been loved off; and your eyes drop out and you get loose in the joints and very shabby. But these things don't matter at all, because once you are Real, you can't be ugly except to people who don't understand.'
