# A New Carmelite Saint



Blessed Titus Brandsma O. Carm., will be canonized on Sunday, May 15, 2022 in St. Peter's Square. Finally, 80 years after his death and 37 years after his beatification, Fr. Titus can be venerated as a saint by the entire Catholic Church. The Carmelite

Order, the Church in The Netherlands, as well as the entire Carmelite Family, joyfully welcome this much awaited news. Brandsma, the 'dangerous little friar', ran foul of the Nazi authorities in Holland during World War II for his stance against Nazi ideology and anti-Semitism. He fought to keep Nazi propaganda out of the Catholic and secular press and to keep Jewish children in Catholic schools. He was arrested, imprisoned, and finally sent to Dachau Concentration Camp where he was killed by lethal injection on 26 July 1942. (Fr. Titus visited Mount Carmel in Niagara Falls in the 1930's and gave a lecture. While there he wrote some magnificent things about the thunderous Falls!)

# FAMILY ACTIVITY FOR THE WEEK: Our Lady of Fatima

Hello boys and girls, how is your week going? I bet you are enjoying recess more now that the weather is nice. Do you know that the weather in Portugal in May is about the same as our weather here? Yup! And children like you are also enjoying being outdoors—playing and to some of them, tending sheep.

Let me tell you the story about the 3 children who lived in a small village of Fatima in Portugal. It was May 13th, 1917 (105 years ago), a beautiful day just like today, the three shepherd children, Lucia (9 years old) and her cousins Francisco (8 years old) and his sister Jacinta (6 years old), were playing outside, watching sheep. The world was in turmoil at that time with the first world war. Many countries were at war. Food was very scarce and many people suffered.

However, May 13, 1917 was a different day than any other days in the history of the world. As the three children were playing in the field, an apparition of 'a woman all in white, more brilliant than the sun' presented itself to the three children saying, "Please don't be afraid of me, I'm not going to harm you." The woman wore a white mantle, edged with gold and held a rosary in her hand. Lucia asked her where she came from. The woman replied, "I come from Heaven." The woman asked them to pray and devote themselves to the Holy Trinity and to "say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war."

The woman appeared to the children on the 13th of each month from May to October of that year. On October 13th, Lucia asked the woman her name and she answered, "I am the Lady of the Rosary."

That same day, 70,000 people had turned out to witness the apparition, following a promise by the woman that she would show the people that the apparitions were true. They saw the sun make three circles and move around the sky in an incredible



zigzag movement in a manner which left no doubt in their minds about the veracity of the apparitions. By 1930 the Bishop had approved of the apparitions and they have been approved by the Church as authentic.

So here you are, boys and girls, this is the story of our Lady of Fatima and the 3 children.

It is very important to pray. Praying is talking to God and showing God that He is very special to us. He is the most BFF of our hearts.

And you know what, you are very special to God too! So, let us heed our Lady of Fatima's request and pray every single day.

Every time you pray, add 3 extra Hail Mary and let us offer it for:

1 Hail Mary for world peace 1 Hail Mary for the Church 1 Hail Mary for families, especially your family

Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us.
