1. Pick up a purple sheet outside the parish office, complete them at home and drop




them in the church when completed. **OR**



JESUS, THE LEADER

Hi guys! Have you played the game "Follow the Leader?" It's a game where everyone do what the leader does or go where the leader goes. It's kinda like the sheep and their shepherd.

A group of sheep is called a herd. Because they get frightened easily, a sheep likes to stay in a herd. The sheep stick together and go where the leader sheep goes. Sometimes though, the herd may go to areas where it is dangerous for them like to the cliff or where predators like wolves are.



And that's where a good shepherd comes in. A good shepherd will take care of the sheep. He leads them to green pastures where they can eat grass safely. He also protects them from predators. The sheep knows their shepherd and follows him wherever he goes.

JESUS, THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Wait guys does this remind you of what Jesus said? Jesus said that He is the good shepherd! He said, "*I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep, and my sheep knows me.*" (John 10:14)

Well, we're kinda like the sheep. We like to stay in a crowd and often do what the crowd does or go where the crowd goes even if it is not good for us. That's why we need a good shepherd to lead and protect us.

How do the sheep knows their shepherd? Well, they spend time with him and they trust him to take care of them. They know his voice and his face.



It's the same with us, boys and girls. Jesus is our good shepherd. To know him, we need to spend some time with him. We can read the bible. Ask Mom and Dad to get you a Catholic Children's Bible or to read you a story about Jesus from the bible. We can also know more about Jesus when we come to Mass. If we listen carefully to the prayers, the songs, the readings, and the homily, we will know more about our good shepherd. And another way to know Jesus more is when we pray and talk to him about our day or about anything. *Jesus always listens.* So, boys and girls, let's say a thank you to Jesus for being our good shepherd, okay? Here we go.
