

# **Jesus' Short Stories**

Hi guys, I hope that you are all having a wonderful and fun summer. Maybe some of you are doing camping or telling stories with friends and families. Do you know that Jesus likes to tell stories too? Jesus' stories are called parables. He told us a story about the good Samaritan, the prodigal son, the lost sheep, and many other short stories that teaches us something important.
