

Along the Mystical Carmelite Way The Interior Castle By St. Teresa of Avila

St. Teresa compares the seven rooms of the Castle with as many degrees of prayer, whereby we enter within ourselves and draw nearer to God. So that, penetrating to the depths of our soul and gaining perfect self-knowledge,

we reach the seventh room where God Himself dwells, with Whom we become united by as perfect a union as is possible in the present life, being made partakers of His light and love. In the first, man is cleansed



from sin and habitual imperfection by the use of the sacraments and by voluntary mortification of the passions. The mind is purified by sedulous meditation on the last end and on the Life and Passion of Christ, which must ever be the great model of the Christian. This first portion of the way to heaven can be covered by the help of the ordinary means of grace, without any direct and extraordinary intervention of divine power. The second part differs in many ways from the first. It comprises the passive purification of the soul and the passive enlightenment of the mind. By sending it keen interior and exterior trials and sufferings, God completes the cleansing of the soul in a manner far surpassing any voluntary effort of man. By raising it to the stage of contemplation He gives it fresh light on the mysteries of our Redemption. The mind is then no longer compelled to strain the memory, the reason, and the will, in order to dwell upon the great truths of religion and to derive some personal benefit therefrom, for these truths are now more or less permanently before it and fill it with holy thoughts, sometimes giving it consolation in trouble, at other times striking a



warning note against imperfection. Again, the subtraction of sensible consolation, and the interior aridity arising therefrom, leave a terrible blank in the soul, showing it that, without God's help, it is mere nothingness. This apparent estrangement from God is the keen-

est trial that can befall a soul, but also the most powerful means of cleansing it from the least, the most subtle imperfections. (Intro Excerpt)

BLESSED SACRAMENT ADORATION

Adoration typically refers to Eucharistic Adoration, which, in the most basic terms, is the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass. We can show our adoration to



God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. You can come to the Parish Adoration Chapel anytime during chapel hours. There is no need to sign-up or ask permission to attend, you can just show up and be with Lord.

If you can commit to spending an hour before the Blessed Sacrament on the same day and time every week, then you can sign up as a watcher.

As a form of respect, you should always genuflect or bow when you see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect and silence. Always keep in mind that you are in the presence of God!

Regular Adoration Chapel Hours:

The Parish Adoration Chapel is a place of silent, personal prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

Sacrament of Matrimony

"The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring. This



covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament" (CCC #1601). The biblical basis of the sacrament of matrimony is given Gen 2:24 – "a man leaves his parents and *clings to his wife and they become one flesh"* and in Mark 10:2-12; Matt 19:1-9 - where Jesus teaches against divorce; "What God has joined together, let no one sepa*rate.*" Jesus blesses the couple of Cana by miraculously converting water into wine (Jn 2.1-11). In Eph 5:22-33; 1Cor 7:10-16 – Paul stresses the unity of husbands and wives. The central liturgical formula in the celebration of the sacrament of matrimony is said by the bride and groom because they are the actual ministers of this sacrament: "I, (name), take you, (name), to be my husband/wife. I promise to be true to you in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health. I will love you and honor you all the days of my life." (or a similar formula). Here the officiating priest is only the official witness of the Church. The central action of the sacrament is the public promise made by the bride and groom accepting each other as spouse for life in all life situations. The exchange of rings that follows is only a visible sign of this verbal commitment. As a result of the sacrament of matrimony, the bride and groom get united ("one flesh") in God's eyes; becoming a publicly and legally recognized couple.
