Mount Carmel Significance

Carmel's significance in the Old Testament is multifaceted, both as a geographic landmark and a site of profound spiritual events. Often referred to as "the garden of God," Carmel's lush landscapes stand out amid the

arid regions surrounding it. The mountain also represents a sanctuary, a place of refuge and contemplation.

Mount Carmel's soaring heights unfortunately also became high places of idol worship. There were altars to the false god Baal and his



goddess wife Ashtoreth on Mount Carmel. For this reason, Elijah chose this mountain range as the place to challenge the priests of these false gods and show the people which god was the True God (1 Kings 18:19). In perhaps the most well-known account featuring Mount Carmel, Elijah told the false priests to build altars, prepare their sacrifice, and to pray to their god for fire to then burn the sacrifice. After the priests failed to call down fire from their god, Elijah asked that water be poured over the altar he had built to the One True God. He asked that so much water be poured over it that the wood was saturated and water overflowed to lay in a trench below. When Elijah then prayed to the One True God, God sent down fire that consumed not only the sacrifice, but "the wood and the stones and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench" (1 Kings 18:38). The people fell on their faces and proclaimed, "The LORD, he is God; the LORD, he is God" (1 Kings 18:39). So, here at Mount Carmel, God displayed His power through Elijah, using both a consuming fire and life-giving water in



the form of rain. God revealed Himself to be the One True God worthy of all our worship. Carmel embodies the concept of divine revelation. Carmel's elevation thus becomes a symbol of spiritual ascent, encouraging individuals to

strive for greater heights in their own spiritual journeys.

LUKE, THE EVANGELIST

A Syrian from Antioch was the inspired author of the third Gospel. This Gospel can be dated at the latest at the end of AD 62 or the beginning of 63. Luke mainly addressed people with a Gentile background. A physician by profession, a man of culture with perfect Greek, he was a disciple of Paul and



was an early Gentile convert, from about the year 40. He accompanied Paul on his second journey (49-53) from Troas to Philippi (Acts 16:10-37), remaining there for some years, until he again joined Paul toward the end of his third journey (53-58). He stayed with the Apostle when he was imprisoned in Caesarea; he was with him on his adventurous trip from Caesarea to Rome and during his first Roman captivity (Col. 4:14, Phil. 1:24). Luke claims (Lk 1:2) that he has collected matter for his gospel after consulting the eye witnesses of Jesus' ministry including apostles and Mary. He begins by emphasizing the continuity of the work of salvation begun by God in the Old Testament and brought to fulfillment in the New. Luke asserts that Jesus came to redeem man from sin, to free him from slavery to the devil and from eternal death. Luke's account stresses the universal character of salvation. Salvation starts in Jerusalem, the center of all Jesus' activity. Luke starts his Gospel there, and there he concludes it. He leaves over to his second book-the Acts of the Apostles-the account of the spread of the Church.

3RD ORDER LAY CARMELITES


